Dear Stakeholder

As previously communicated, Huon's harvest operations in Norfolk Bay was a temporary measure to achieve industry-wide biosecurity farming outcomes.

This temporary harvest site at Norfolk Bay enabled Huon to ensure that POMV was not spread to juvenile salmon stocked in the Huon River.

Huon's approach was, and has always been, to ensure the highest biosecurity standards are developed and maintained across our farming operations.

Since early July, there has been no evidence of POMV in these fish populations. All populations have been tested for POMV, across 10 separate laboratory submissions and all results have confirmed negative POMV status (most recent submission on 11 October).

Huon will now be exiting Norfolk Bay slightly earlier than first scheduled; the final onsite harvest will take place during the week beginning 5 November.

One harvest pen will be removed within the next week with the remaining pen removed by the week ending Friday 16 November. All remaining equipment will be removed by the end of December in line with previous communications.

Prior to removal, inner nets will be removed in-situ and transported to on-land net cleaning facilities. High pressure washing of the predator nets, pen collars, feed bins and other infrastructure subject to biofouling will be undertaken in-situ.

Huon can now confidently move the remaining fish from Storm Bay to Hideaway Bay for harvest, as per our normal, usual practice.

We have notified government authorities of our intended action.
